UTC Background

- UTC is required to supervise and regulate about 60 solid waste collection companies
- One Investigator for solid waste investigations and solid waste enforcement
 - Primary emphasis on non-permitted solid waste operators
- Working on hiring a second investigator in the program.





Governing Laws, Rules, and Policies

- RCW 81.77
- WAC 480-70-216
- Commission Enforcement Policy Docket A-120061

Solid Waste Enforcement

- Establish relationships with city and county solid waste and health directors
- Department of Ecology
- Increase public safety
- Reduce non-permitted operators

Safety and Destination Checks


- Solid waste companies must comply with federal safety requirements and undergo routine safety inspections
- CVSA certified investigators perform vehicle inspection roadside or at transfer stations
- Certain safety violations warrant administrative penalty
- Companies taking corrective action are typically awarded mitigation or suspension

Investigation Process and Focus

- Reviews allegations and technical assistance
 - Company can apply for authority (subject to protest)
 - Cease operating
- Continued operating
 - Staff investigation report
 - Formal hearing and Classification
 - Penalties

Investigation Process and Focus

- Leads generated by companies, county facilities, state agencies, and advertising

Reporting

- There is no state law requiring solid waste collection companies report critical motor carrier transportation incidents to UTC
- News media, the public, or reviewed during a routine safety investigation
- Notify Jason Sharp and Mathew Perkinson of reportable accidents involving a fatality.
- Other examples?

Violations

- If violation of law or rule occurs, UTC considers a variety of enforcement actions
 - Technical assistance and education, encourage voluntary compliance
 - Subpoena, complaint, and penalty

Performance Measures

- Implemented performance measures
 - Minimum of four technical assistance letters each month
 - Create back-up and cross training to minimize impact of transition

Performance Measures

- Prior twelve-month period
 - 57 cases
 - 36 non-permitted compliance letters
 - 8 docketed cases
 - 23 violations
 - Created cross training program

State and City Partners

- Increased communications
- Joint investigations
- Data sharing
- Participate in local SWAC meetings
